

# **AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL MUSEUM OF EDUCATION PRIZE FOR HERITAGE, MUSEUMS AND CONSERVATION**

## **GUIDELINES**

These guidelines are to provide information to students wishing to apply for the Australian National Museum of Education Prize for Heritage, Museums and Conservation.

### **What is the purpose of the prize?**

The Australian National Museum of Education prize for Heritage, Museums and Conservation is awarded to a graduating student with an outstanding academic achievement and who has demonstrated a significant contribution or involvement in the work of the ANME. The individual will be currently undertaking studies in the *Bachelor of Heritage, Museums and Conservation* or a Major in this course at the University of Canberra and has demonstrated this expertise in assisting the ANME with its programs and work.

### **When will prize be available?**

The prize will be offered each year and applications will be judged by a sub-committee of the ANME Board. The members of the sub- committee include Dr Bernard Brown, Dr Tracy Ireland, Dr Malcolm Beazley, and chaired by Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Education) Professor Nicholas Klomp.

One prize may be awarded each calendar year with the announcement at graduation.

Applications may be submitted until the closing date **COB Friday 5th October 2018**.

### **When will I find out the result of my application?**

Applicants will be advised that their application has been received and will be considered as soon as possible following the closing date. The ANME Prize Sub-committee will then rate applications against the selection criteria and provide a recommendation to the ANME Board. The annual winner of the ANME Prize will be confidential until the conferring of degrees ceremony in April of the following year.
